

FROM OPEN ROOF TOP TO CLOSED IRON ROOF

Hailstorms damaged Grace's semi-permanent house. She had difficulty finding where to sleep. First intervention was to cover the roof with a tarpaulin. Touch Ministries has supported in roofing the house, reinforcing the walls with cement mortar and provided the old woman with a water drum. Grace will not need to walk to the local well to collect water during rainy season. She will collect water from her roof top. It will be safe and clean water, free from contamination. She will be safe from water borne disease threat.

Acelun Grace is childless and lives alone. Her life has been secured and made comfortable with safe and better housing, and with God's grace, she will live for many more years. In the pictures below show the change in the housing status.



STAFF HOUSING UNIT CONSTRUCTION

In some weeks to come the staff housing unit will be completed. Construction is at ring beam and later roofing. Once ready teaching staff will occupy it and effectively manage their duties as teachers. The unit will accommodate another three (3) teachers reducing the burden of travel from their village homes to the school every day.



FARMING AND THE EFFECT OF DISEASE

Vegetable growth has been good, but eggplant has been attacked by disease. The would-be fruiting plants are under attack. The affected plants are being uprooted while spraying is ongoing. The diseased plants are being uprooted and burnt to avoid further disease spread. The 1ST picture below is of the affected plant.





A different planting approach has been adopted, seed bedding with well-prepared soils and planting beds prepared for transplanting. Compost manure to be applied during transplanting. This method will be compared with the previous seed bedding system to help choose the one which will prevent disease spread. The plants in the seed bed will be transplanted beginning 10th July

The first ground nut harvest is done. The harvest from the rented land is good with opportunity to do better in future.
